VITAL STATISTICS REPORT WRITING WORKSHOP

Between 7 – 11 January, ESCAP's CRVS team, in collaboration with D4H, kicked off the new year by starting the second phase of the project, "Supporting Improvements to CRVS Systems – A vital statistics report writing initiative." Six new countries used registration data to calculate crude birth rates, total fertility rates, etc. and began drafting vital statistics reports. A second workshop is being planned for late-March where the participants will calculate mortality indicators, specifically related to causes of death, as well as continue writing a final report. LOOKING AT THE NUMBERS IN NIUE

As a result of the hard work from Niue's Statistics and Immigration Office, the Ministry of Finance and Planning, as well as with support from the Secretariat of the Pacific Community (SPC), ESCAP is pleased to publish Niue's second Vital Statistics Report on the GITP website. The report covers data from 2012 – 2016 and includes the indicators one would expect from a VS report (crude birth rate, age-specific mortality rate, etc.), as well as information on causes of death.
